



What is Wobble Trap?

A wobbler is a motorized accessory designed to augment clay pigeon throwers. It is stationary, but oscillates on both horizontal and vertical axes; hence the name "Wobble." The shooter calls for the clay to be thrown and it could come from the trap at any angle. Its primary function is to automatically and randomly change the position of each target, ensuring that no two presentations are the same.

Trap Shooting

In trap shooting, shooters stand in a line or in individual shooting stations arranged in a semicircle. The shooting stations are usually positioned at different angles from a central trap house.

In each round, shooters take turns calling for a target, and the trap machine randomly releases a clay target, sending it flying away from the trap house.

The objective is to break or shatter the clay target with a shotgun blast. Shooters are scored based on how many targets they hit out of the total number attempted.

Skeet Shooting

Skeet shooting is typically done on a designated field with two trap houses, one high house and one low house. There are eight shooting stations arranged in a semicircle between these two houses.

In skeet shooting, targets are thrown from both the high and low houses in a specific pattern, with one high and one low target released simultaneously at different points along the field.

Shooters move between the stations in a predetermined order, taking shots at the targets as they fly across the field.

The objective is to break both the high and low targets for each station. Skeet shooting is known for its challenging crossing shots and requires quick target acquisition and accuracy.

The 1st match is a .22 match. The 2nd match is an open caliber centerfire match.

A competitor may elect to fire .22 caliber during the centerfire match, but not vice versa.

Each match is a 30-round match (also known as a National Match Course or NMC), fired in stages. The stages are slow, timed, and rapid.

The slow-fire target is 10 shots over 10 minutes, shot at a target a 50-yards. The timed-fire stage is 5 shots over 20 seconds, fired twice at 25-yards. The rapidfire stage is 5 shots over 10 seconds, fired twice, at 25-yards.

Each target is worth 100 points and the match is worth 300 points.

Range Rules & Safety

Rifle Range (RR)

- All Shooting must take place from the bench under the shelter at fixed distances with no portable stands.
- Shoot only at targets in your lane. Cross-lane shooting prohibited.
- (10) Rifle Stations: Only long guns and Carbines can be shot at these stations. Shotguns with deer slugs only.
- (2) Pistol Stations: Only Pistol Calibers and Rimfire can be used at these stations.

Outdoor Range (OUT)

- Shooters using the target frames must be on the same line.
- Bring 24" x 18" to 24" cardboard with you, down to the frames to staple or tape your target onto and place into the target frame.
- If you wish to have a table to set equipment on, bring your own.
- Only Pistol Calibers and Rimfire can be used on this Range.
- Please see the complete list of rules posted inside the Club near the Shoot Room.

Indoor Range (IN)

- Access to range is granted only after attending the indoor range safety course.
- All rules of the indoor range will be covered in the safety course; all attendees are required to fire and hit a 12" target 5 out of 5 times at 20'.

Trap, Skeet, Sporting Clays

- Field/Sporting shotguns only with 7 ½ to 9 shot size.
- Lead ammo only; NO steel shot.
- While trap shooting with a semi-automatic shotgun, a shell catcher or rubber band MUST be used!

Range Safety Classes

Prior to using any of the Club's ranges, you must take the MANDATORY Safety Course for that range.

A separate MANDATORY Safety Course is offered for each of the three ranges:

- Rifle Range (RR)
- Outdoor Range (OUT)
- Indoor Range (IN)

Upon completion of the Rifle Range (RR) course, you will be issued a BLUE lanyard.

Upon completion of the Outdoor Range (OUT) course, you will be issued a YELLOW lanyard.

Upon completion of the Indoor Range (IN) course, you will be issued a key FOB for range access.

- Be sure the gun is safe to operate.
- Wear eye and ear protection as appropriate.
- Store guns so they are not accessible to unauthorized persons.
- Use only the correct ammunition for your gun.
- Never use alcohol or drugs before or while shooting.
- · Be aware that certain types of guns and many shooting activities require additional safety precautions.
